The Library Near You

I love libraries. I love ALL TYPES of libraries. I can spend hours just wandering through the stacks, even when I don't have a specific topic in mind. (But, I will admit, I dislike libraries with closed stacks, although I will use them when necessary.) I can easily get distracted from a particular library section, just by looking at titles of books on the way to a Dewey decimal number. Are you like that? Or do you generally avoid libraries? Do you ever visit your local library for genealogy research? If you don't, you may be missing out on some unexpected, valuable resources, in print form. Yes, there is life before and after on-line connections. By using your on-line access to local libraries, you may also run across some resources and information that are totally unexpected, and you may make that special trip down to the library near you.

Looking on-line (from home) at the Tempe Public Library catalog, I found that there are 236 books under the "genealogy" keyword, 1201 under "family history", 306 Indiana, 2097 Virginia, and 1208 Massachusetts. An unexpected find was a book entitled *The Women of the House: How a colonial she-merchant built a mansion, a fortune, and a dynasty*. This book is about Margaret Hardenbroeck Phillips, a seventeenth-century woman in New Amsterdam, who also had five children. If you have ancestors from New York during that time, you may find the background information interesting even though your ancestors may not be mentioned directly. Another book in Tempe's library that might be of interest is a biography of William Johnson, an Irish man who lived on the frontier of New York in the 1730s and 1740s. Did you have any ancestors who seemed to move into frontier areas, before statehood? What types of relationships did they have with Indian tribes, or other settlers?

The Glendale Public Library has 155 books listed under genealogy, 53 under family history, 161 under Indian, and 529 under Massachusetts. Now I agree that a book on the 300 most selective colleges that shows up when Massachusetts is put into the keyword field may not help with your family search, but the book by William Francis Kuntz titled *Criminal Sentencing in Three Nineteenth-century Cities: Social history of punishment in New York, Boston, and Philadelphia, 1830-1880* may have relevance to you and your research. The Glendale Public Library also had 14,534 biographies.

When I looked at the Scottsdale Public Library catalog, some of the 287 books I found when I put "Indiana" in the keyword field were about Indiana Jones. However, they have 50 book titles that show up when you put in Indiana History. One of these is a juvenile fiction book by Richard Peck about a fourteen-year-old tomboy who is interested in automobiles and is influenced by the arrival in her small Indiana town of four young librarians. While this is fiction, many fiction writers either are very familiar with their locales or do extensive research before writing. Don't just automatically disregard fiction. For non-fiction, this library also has 2091 books on Virginia, 1198 on Massachusetts and 22,897 biographies.

These are just a few of the resources I discovered, sitting at home. Now I need to actually go into the libraries and check out their other resources. All of the libraries mentioned above, except for Glendale, allow residents of Maricopa County to obtain a FREE library card which allows access to all services. The Glendale Public Library has numerous options, from free to those with a fee, depending upon the services you wish to use.

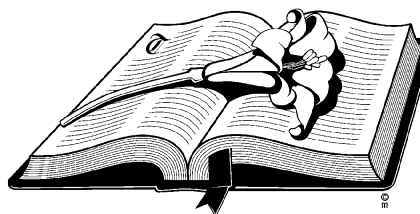

BLIZZARD

Some of us that are older and have lived in the northern plains in our youth have heard tell of the horror stories of the terrible blizzards that have taken place. North and South Dakota are noted for their winds and not a lot to stop it. The blizzard of 1888 was one such blizzard where many lost their lives. This anecdote was written by a great uncle of mine. Janice Ekman **Motley**, PV Chapter

The Blizzard of January 12, 1888 in Spink County, SD, told by Hiram Taylor who lived in Northville, SD.

“The morning was bright and bonny.

There was some snow on the ground. Before noon the blizzard hit and at one the visibility was zero. A lot of people were caught away from home. Some were fortunate and saw it coming and were able to get back home before it got here. Some spent the time in a hay or straw stack. Hiram and his neighbor W.H. Roberts had gone to the Post Office to get their mail and were there when the blizzard struck. They decided to try and make it home. To keep themselves together they held hands and walked facing the blizzard for over three blocks to the Taylor home. Mr. Roberts was invited to come in but he thought he should try to get home to his family so he wouldn't stop and went on north across the street toward his home. Fortunately he made it but Hiram didn't know for three day, the duration of the blizzard, if he got home or not.

Hiram's father Levi Taylor was out on his farm three miles west of Northville by himself during the storm. Mrs. Levi Taylor was visiting one of their daughters in Iowa. That was the reason he was home alone. He was in the house when the storm struck. So he was all right. He had plenty of fuel to keep warm during the three days of the blizzard.

There was a Miss Stansfield teaching school five miles south of Northville who tried to walk home in that storm, a distance of about a mile. She didn't make it. They found her about half way home after the storm.”
